Stud Dog Brood Bitch Brace

Bred-by-Exhibitor (BBE) Class Eligibility: The Bred By Exhibitor Class shall be for dogs that are:

- Six months of age or older as of the first day of the show;
- Not Champions of record on the date of closing of entries for the show;
- Individually registered with The American Kennel Club as of the date of closing of entries for the show;
- Owned or co-owned by any of the breeders of record as of the date of the closing of entries for the show;

The person handling the dog in this class must be a breeder of record and an owner of record of this dog. In any subsequent classes for which a dog from the Bred By Exhibitor class becomes eligible, there are no restrictions as to who may handle.

Best of Breed: The following categories of dogs may be entered and shown in Best of Breed competition: Dogs that are Champions of Record and dogs which according to their owner's records have completed the requirements for a championship but whose championships are unconfirmed. The entry and showing of dogs whose championships are unconfirmed is limited

to a period of 90 days from the date of the show where the dog completed the requirements for a championship according to the owner's records. If, at the end of the 90 day period, the championship of a dog has not been confirmed by AKC, no further entries of the dog for Best of Breed competition are to be made until its championship has been confirmed by AKC.

Move-Ups: Dogs which, according to their owner's records, have completed the requirements for a championship after the closing of entries for the show, but whose championships are unconfirmed, may be transferred from one of the regular classes to the Best of Breed competition, provided this transfer is made by the Superintendent at least one-half hour prior to the start of judging at the show.

Veteran: Open to dogs and bitches 7 years old or over. Winners from these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed. Neutered dogs and spayed bitches are allowed to compete in Veteran Classes at independent specialty shows.

Stud Dog Class: For Stud Dogs and two of their Get. Stud dog must be entered in the Stud Dog Class and shown in the ring with their Get. Owner of the Stud Dog need not necessarily be the owner of the Get. The Get must be entered individually in one of the regular classes, Best of Breed, or some non-regular class other than Stud Dog. Judging will be based on the merits of the Get.

Brood Bitch Class: For Brood Bitches and two of their Produce. Brood Bitch must be entered in the Brood Bitch Class and shown in the ring with their Produce. Owner of the Brood Bitch need not necessarily be the owner of the Produce. The Produce must be entered individually in one of the regular classes, Best of Breed, or some non-regular class other than Brood Bitch. Judging will be based on the merits of the Produce.

Brace Class: Each Brace shall be composed of two Scottish Terriers, irrespective of sex, owned by an identical owner. Entry Fee is \$20.00 for the unit. If the dog that is part of the Brace is not entered in another Class, it must be entered for "Brace Class only." Show Brace Class in "Additional Entry" portion of the entry form. If more than one Brace is entered by identical owner, the dog comprising each Brace Unit must be designated "Brace #1, Brace #2, Etc.

Note: As the Judge's decision in the Stud Dog, Brood Bitch and Brace Classes will be based on the merits of more than one dog or bitch, no one of the dogs or bitches making up the entry judged first in these classes will be eligible to compete for Best of Breed by virtue of having won these classes.

Junior Showmanship Competition

Judge: Ms. Kathi Brown

No charge if entered in a regular class. Junior Showmanship only, \$20.00.

AKC Junior Handler numbers are now required for entry in Junior Showmanship Competition. Numbers may be obtained from the American Kennel Club, 919-816-3776.

Novice Junior Class: For boys and girls at least 9 and under 12 years old on the day of the show who, at the time entries close, have not won 3 first places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Intermediate Class: For boys and girls at least 12 and under 15 years old on the day of the show who, at the time entries close, have not won 3 first places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Novice Senior Class: For boys and girls at least 15 and under 18 years old on the day of the show who, at the time entries close, have not won 3 first places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Junior Class: For boys and girls at least 9 and under 12 years old on the day of the

show who, at the time entries close, have won 3 first places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Intermediate Class: For boys and girls at least 12 and under 15 years old on the day of the show who, at the time entries close, have won 3 first places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Open Senior Class: For boys and girls at least 15 and under 18 years old on the day of the show who, at the time entries close, have won 3 first places, with competition present, in a Novice Class at a licensed or member show.

Sweepstakes

This Sweepstakes is open to all Scottish Terriers at least six months and under eighteen months on the day of the show. Sweepstakes judging will be held prior to the Regular Classes. Winners of the Sweepstakes classes will compete for Best in Sweepstakes and Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Sweepstakes. PROFESSIONAL HANDLERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO SHOW DOGS IN SWEEPSTAKES UNLESS THE DOG IS OWNED BY THE HANDLER OR IMMEDIATE FAMILY OR BRED BY THE HANDLER.

Entry fee is \$15.00. All entries in Sweepstakes must also be entered in a regular class at this show at the regular entry fee of \$20.00 for puppies under twelve months of age or \$27.00 for Junior Dogs/Bitches. Entries shall be made at the same time on the same form as for the regular class. Indicate "Sweepstakes" and the appropriate age and sex in the space provided for "Additional Classes."

- See page 2 for instructions for entries. Acknowledgement of entries will be made as soon as practical with tickets and/or identification cards.
- No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. NO TELEPHONE, TELEGRAPH OR UNSIGNED ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED. Entries not on an official AKC Entry Form or photocopies of Entry Forms without agreement and rules on the reverse side of the Official AKC Entry Form are NOT ACCEPTABLE.
- Errors on Entry Blanks: Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors, and no entry fees will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Changes, additions, or corrections to entry forms must be received in writing or by e-mail prior to close of entries. Those received by telephone **are not acceptable**. There will be no refund of duplicate entries. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry.
- Entry fees shall not be refunded in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by the Veterinarian or Judge or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee or cancellation of a win by the American Kennel Club. No entry fee will be refunded if the show cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an Act of God, public emergency, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the club.
- JUDGES ARE NOT REQUIRED TO WAIT FOR DOGS. They will adhere as closely as possible to the judging schedule. The owner or handler of each dog is solely responsible for the presence of their dogs in the ring when their classes are called to be judged.
- The Scottish Terrier Club of New England assumes no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children.
- A recording fee of \$.50 and an event services fee of \$3.00 will be required for each dog entered at any licensed or member club show or obedience trial. These event service and recording fees are to be collected by the show-giving club and paid to the American Kennel Club. If a dog is entered in more than one class in the show, these Fees are to be collected on the first entry only (American Kennel Club Rules Applying to Dog Shows, Chapter 11, Section 2).
- Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. The Scottish Terrier Club of New England recommends that all dogs traveling to shows be current on all regular vaccines.

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.
